Speed camera infringement notices are posted to the address of the driver of the vehicle and not to the registered owner of the vehicle.

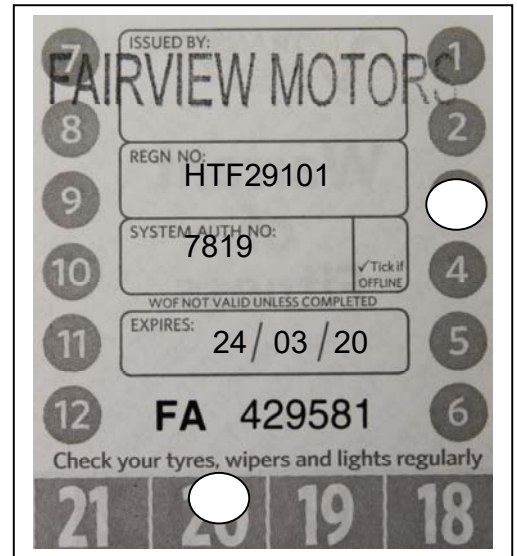
