START WITH A STRONG FOUNDATION

Your home is built upon a RibRaft concrete floor, a method where foundations sit directly on the ground. These types of foundations are often quicker to construct than traditional methods. They perform better in earthquakes and have been recommended for Christchurch rebuilds. For your warmth and comfort, they come with an insulation rating.



THERMALLY ISOLATED DOUBLE GLAZED WINDOWS

Thermal breaks on all your window joinery with Low E Xcel glass give you a warmer, drier home. They keep the condensation off your glass as well as your aluminium window frames, removing problems with mould or the winter chill.



NATURAL VENTILATION

Breathe easy - We install natural air integrated ventilators in all of our bathrooms and toilets to prevent damp, stale air and keep it fresh.
